Subject: PSHE

Spiritual

 PSHE supports spiritual development by providing pupils to with opportunities to experience a sense of enjoyment and fascination in learning about themselves, others and the world around them. They are also provided with opportunities to reflect on their experiences. Children are encouraged to consider different roles and values in society and how these affect our daily lives.

Moral

 PSHE supports children's spiritual development by helping them in recognising the difference between right and wrong and to readily apply this understanding in their own lives. PSHE also provides children with an understanding of the consequences of their behaviour and actions. Children are taught about how their choices affect the wider world by learning about climate change, for example, and how they can make a positive impact in the world with their choices. Gender stereotypes is another topic children are taught about in order to help them understand the different views in the wider world and how they can contribute to a more fair and equal society.

Social

 PSHE supports social development by teaching children about relationships, health and living in the wider world. Children are taught the importance of respect and tolerance, recognising their feelings and emotions, growing and changing and recognising issues in the wider world and the impact of their actions.

Cultural

 PSHE supports cultural development by teaching them about different cultures within the school and the wider world in order to help them to appreciate the importance of equality, respect and tolerance in modern Britain.
