Tricky sound!

There are 2 ways that Spanish people pronounce this letter.

v

1. A hard 'b' like in the English word 'bee'. To pronounce this one, the lips come together. Usually, the 'v' is at the start of the word.

Example:

Voy – I am going – 'boy'

2. A softer 'b' where the lips don't quite touch, usually in the middle of a word.

Example:

Vivo – I live – 'bee-bo'

Example:

utilizar – to use – 'oo-tee-lee-thar'
